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NOTICES

1. ANNOUNCEMENTS:

To avoid making costly errors, please pay close attention to all announcements made from the auction stand, especially concerning horses on which you intend to bid.

2. ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF PURCHASE:

After making the final bid on a horse, you will be asked to complete and sign the Acknowledgement of Purchase Form. Be sure to confirm the correct Hip Number and price before you sign. Please print your name and address (including Postal Code/Zip Code) clearly, since this document is used for Jockey Club Certificate Transfers, invoicing and in publishing the sales results.

3. CARE OF HORSES: Please be reminded that the title passes at the fall of the hammer, at which time the purchaser assumes all risk and responsibility for the horse. **ALL HORSES MUST BE REMOVED FROM THE SALE PREMISES NO LATER THAN 24 HOURS FROM THE FALL OF THE HAMMER.**

Buyers should notify both the consignor and the sales office when they intend to move horses after the sale.

4. STABLE RELEASE:

In order to remove a horse from the grounds, you must obtain a Stable Release form from the sales office. Please confirm that the release you obtain represents the correct hip number. Also be sure to give the release to the person ultimately responsible for removing your horse from the grounds.

5. COGGINS TESTS:

All horses sold in this sale are required to have been tested Coggins Negative within 6 months of the date of sale.

6. TRANSFER & REPORT OF OWNERSHIP:

The transfer of ownership for all Thoroughbreds must be reported to the Jockey Club by the new owner, within 60 days of the transfer, using a Transfer of Ownership form. The Certificate of Registration is not required and there is no fee for any transfer. Forms are available in Sales Office.

7. EVA:

There is no post-sale of return to EVA unless offered specifically and individually by the consignor through the sales company. Horses in this sale are NOT required to be pre-sale tested for EVA. A list of those that have been tested and their results will be available in the sales office.

8. STAKES ENGAGEMENTS:

Unless announced otherwise all eligibility payments due after date of sale are the responsibility of the buyer, who should promptly notify the proper racing associations of the new ownership in order to receive direct billing.

DEFINITIONS

Registered Canadian-Bred

Thoroughbreds foaled in Canada and have been registered as such with the Canadian Thoroughbred Horse Society, National Office.

Registered Ontario-Bred

A foal that is Registered Canadian-Bred and is foaled out of an Ontario Resident mare. Ontario Resident Mare status is determined by the rules set out by the Ontario Horse Improvement Program administrators.

Ontario-Sired

In order for horses to be recognized as Ontario-Sired the only requirement is that they be by stallions that were nominated to the Ontario Sires Stakes Program, through the Canadian Thoroughbred Horse Society (Ontario Division), in the year the mare is bred.

POST SALE RNA PROGRAM

The CTHS will be giving buyers, that have established credit, an opportunity to bid on horses that were not sold (RNA) at sales time.

Interested purchasers can simply go to the Sales Results page and click on Submit a Bid for the horse(s) they are interested in purchasing. This will send an email to both the consignor and the CTHS advising them of their interest.

It will then be left up to the consignor and the purchaser to negotiate. If a post sale agreement is finalized the parties must move forward through the CTHS Sales Office.

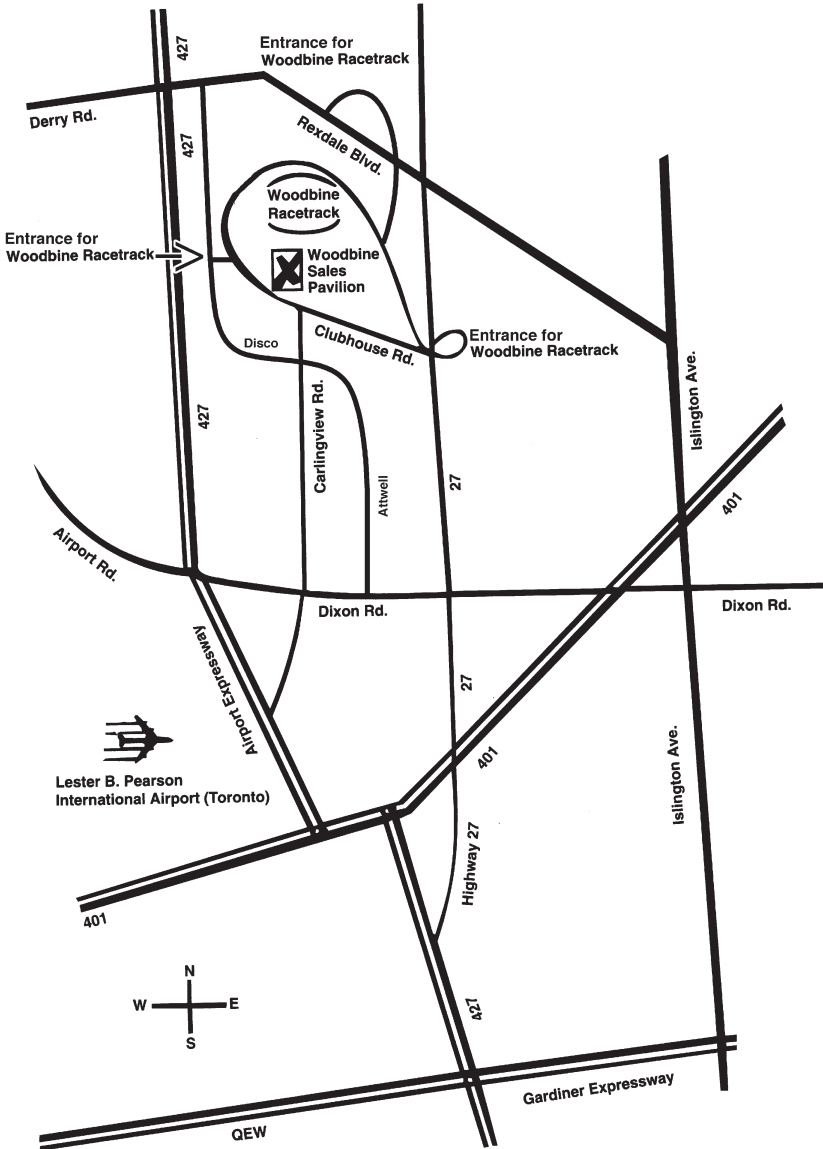

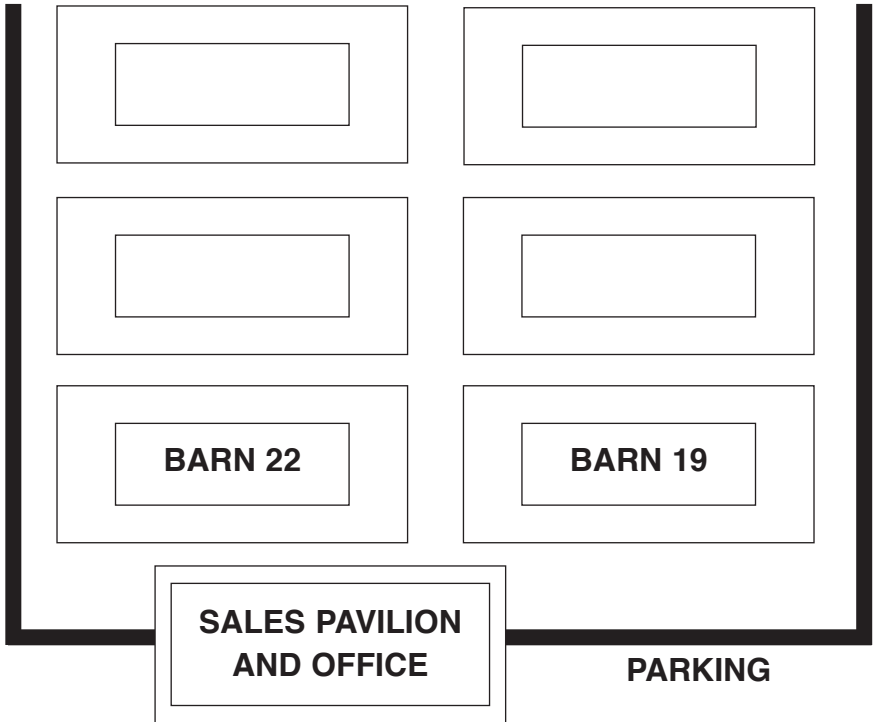

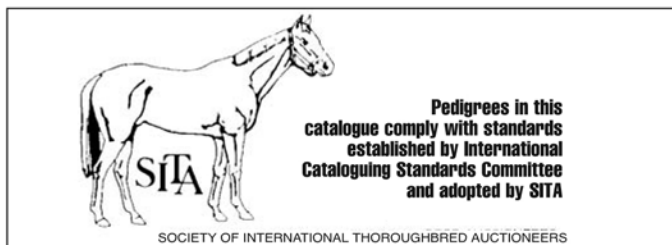

CREDIT INFORMATION

CANADIAN RESIDENTS

Unless credit has been established with CTHS (Ontario Division) at least five days prior to the sale, the terms shall be cash at the time of sale. Payment will be accepted in the form of Canadian currency, certified cheque, cashier's or travellers' cheques, made payable to CTHS (Ontario Division).

NON-RESIDENTS

Arrangements for purchases by non-residents must be approved by CTHS (Ontario Division) at least 10 days prior to sale. Payment will be accepted in Canadian currency, by cashier's cheque in Canadian funds drawn on banks outside to Canada, Official Bank Cheque issued by an accredited Canadian bank, payable in Canadian currency or irrevocable sight letter of credit confirmed by the Bank of Montreal.

This irrevocable sight letter of credit must specifically provide that payment is to be made at sight upon presentation by CTHS (Ontario Division) of (1) invoice for each and every horse purchased, showing full purchase price, inclusive of HST and other charges, as applicable (2) executed copy of CTHS (Ontario Division)'s standard business form "Acknowledgement of Purchase Agreement".

AGENT

If purchase is represented by an agent, such agent must either comply with all provisions set herein as if he were the purchaser, or such agent must submit a letter of authorization signed by purchaser, addressed to CTHS (Ontario Division) which states that agent is authorized to purchase at a particular sale for account of the purchaser and that such purchaser has complied in advance with all the provisions hereinbefore set forth.

ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF PURCHASE

Pursuant to Condition FOURTEENTH, any yearling or weanling entered in this Sale shall not have been administered any exogenous anabolic steroids (EAS) within 45 days of this sale. This Limited Warranty may be implemented as follows:

- Purchaser must request at the time of purchase that blood be drawn to test for the presence of exogenous anabolic steroids
- CTHS will co-ordinate the testing with a designated veterinarian and laboratory and report the results to consignor and purchaser in a timely manner.
- If the horse tests positive, the purchaser has the right, within 24 hours of notification, to rescind the sale at which time the horse will be returned to consignor.
- Purchaser shall be fully reimbursed for all costs and expenses incurred, including reimbursement for the \$500 cost of the test.

1) If you desire to have your yearling/ weanling tested for exogenous anabolic steroids, at the cost of \$500 please check this box at time of purchase.

PROCEDURES FOR PAYMENT OF ACCOUNT

1. **SETTLEMENT OF ACCOUNT** - Purchaser shall make settlement within thirty minutes of conclusion of sales session in which the horse is sold for the full purchase price. Settlement is to be made in the form of approved bank cheque, certified cheque or travellers cheque, or by Canadian currency unless credit has been approved by CTHS (Ontario Division).

2. **APPROVAL OF CREDIT** - may be obtained by presentation of "A Letter of Credit". The letter of credit is to be irrevocable and issued in the favour of:

3. **AUTHORIZED AGENTS** - All agents purchasing horses for clients and/or consignors shall make known to CTHS (Ontario Division) the name of their principals and shall sign an agent's authorization slip with the cashier of CTHS (Ontario Division).

VISITOR'S TAX REBATE

As of July 1, 2010 the 13% Harmonized Sales Tax must be charged on all horses sold. If the purchaser is a Non-Resident of Canada and the horse is exported outside of Canada within 60 days of purchase the purchaser is entitled to apply for the Visitor's Tax Rebate. The General Application for Rebate of GST/HST is available in the office and will also be mailed with each invoice for purchasers outside of Canada.

BLACK TYPE DEFINITIONS

Black Type Race-Black Type Winner-Black Type Placed

The words “black-type” are the equivalent, in racing, sales terminology and in sales catalogues, of the frequently-used word “stakes.” A stakes race will not always merit “black” type in a sales catalogue.

Black Type Race or Stakes Race

There are several classes of black type races, which are described in the following information. A black type race must, by definition, close for entries at least 72 hours before it is run. Fees must also be paid towards the purse by owners and/or additional (added) money contributed by or through the host racetrack. In addition, a stakes race must have a total purse value distributed on the day of the race of \$50,000 or more. (This minimum was established in January 2007 and is frequently reviewed.) In the more liberal interpretation of “stakes,” the amount of the purse is not always a factor, but a race qualifies for “black type” in sales catalogue following ICSC (International Cataloguing Standards Committee) standards only when it meets the total purse and other criteria.

In pedigrees, a horse’s name, when it is a winner or has placed in a black type race, is indicated in bold (hence “black”) type. Winners’ names are in upper case (capital) bold letters. Horses placing 2nd or 3rd are in lower case bold letters.

In addition, further symbols or designators associated with the black type race will indicate the level or quality of the race in question.

It is important to note that changes in entry requirements, restrictions and purse levels for black type races are not retrospective. Once awarded black type in a pedigree, this information is unchanged and permanently maintained until and unless it is required to be replaced by more current data.

Graded or Group Black Type Races

All around the world “graded” or “group” stakes race (G1, G2 and G3) is recognized as being of the highest quality within any racing jurisdiction. The words “grade” and “group” have identical meaning and qualifications.

The Society of International Thoroughbred Auctioneers (SITA), CTHS (Ontario-Division), uses the rulings of the International Cataloguing Standards Committee (ICSC) in its sales pedigrees to recognize grade or group designators for races.

ICSC maintains and monitors the application of guidelines by racing countries around the world. These countries qualify for several categories for cataloguing purposes as follows:

Part I countries will receive black type status and any race designators including grade/group indicators that are applicable.

Part II countries receive black type status, but will not be eligible to carry any designators such as grade/group indicators.

Part III countries have races listed for informational purposes only and do not receive any black type status.

In the USA, graded races are classified by the American-Graded Stakes Committee of the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders' Association (TOBA). This committee meets regularly to insure its standards of purse money and quality of racing are maintained.

Graded races are non-restricted, (age and sex qualifications are not considered restrictions.) From January 2003, the minimum value for a graded race has been \$100,000.

Listed Black Type Races (L)

Below the quality of graded races, listed races also have a minimum added and/or total purse value, which, in January 2002, was set at \$75,000. For this and for other considerations, they do not qualify as graded black type races.

The name of the listed black-type race is detailed after the subject horse in the pedigree with the designator (L), and, in parentheses, an abbreviation of the host track and the purse earned specifically in that race. Up to the end of December 1990, some listed races were also restricted races and carried the designator (LR). Since that time, listed races may not be restricted.

Restricted Races

Because entry conditions for restricted races are often framed to exclude better horses, these black type races are usually regarded as of lesser quality than graded or listed races. The name of the restricted black type race is detailed after the subject horse in the pedigree with the designator ® and, in parentheses, an abbreviation of the host track and the purse earned specifically in that race.

From January 2003, conditions for black type restricted races were refined and the only restrictions now allowed are those for state-bred runners, non-winners of a sweepstakes, sales graduates and stallions' progeny.

Other Races Identified in Catalogues

There are some black type races which are not restricted, but do not have sufficient purse money to qualify as listed races. These races are identified by name but carry NO designator (G, L or R). The name of the race is detailed after the subject horse and, in parentheses, an abbreviation of the host track and the purse earned specifically in that race.

The amount of purse money to qualify a race for black type status is regularly raised by SITA to insure the quality and integrity of the black type system.

Further Note

In 1985, several other stakes qualified for black type or for inclusion in some form in pedigrees. Subsequent changes have replaced or eliminated these races, but they remain in pedigrees until they are excluded by more current data. Such races carried designators (O), (N) and (Q).

Pedigrees in this catalogue comply with standards established by the International Cataloguing Standards Committee (ICSC) and adopted by the Society of International Thoroughbred Auctioneers (SITA).

THE 2016 ONTARIO SIRES STAKES THOROUGHBRED STALLIONS

All 2017 foals by the following nominated stallions are eligible to the Ontario Sire Stakes Series for their entire racing career. There are no interim payments. The only payments which must be made are the appropriate nomination fees to each stake race at the time of its closing. THIS SALE IS CONDUCTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH, AND ALL ACTS OF INTERESTED PARTIES AND/OR CLAIMS BY THEM SHALL BE GOVERNED BY THE FOLLOWING:

FIRST **APPLICABLE LAW:** All horses in this sale are offered according to the laws of the Province of Ontario. The right to bid, as provided under law, is reserved for all consignors unless otherwise announced.

SECOND **EXCEPT AS SET OUT HEREIN, THERE IS NO REPRESENTATION, WARRANTY OR CONDITION EXPRESS OR IMPLIED BY THE CTHS, OWNER OR CONSIGNOR PURSUANT TO THE SALE OF GOODS ACT OR OTHERWISE. WITHOUT LIMITATION TO THE FOREGOING, THERE IS NO REPRESENTATION OR WARRANTY EXPRESS OR IMPLIED BY CTHS, OWNER OR CONSIGNOR, AS TO THE RACING SOUNDNESS, MERCHANTABILITY OR FITNESS FOR ANY PARTICULAR PURPOSE OF ANY HORSE OFFERED IN THIS SALE. THIRD **BIDDING PROCEDURES:** Unless waived by announcement, there shall be an upset price on any horse offered as set forth on the title page of the sales catalogue. If any opening bid of the upset price is not immediately forthcoming to the auctioneer's call, the horse shall be led out unsold. Minimum acceptable increases in bidding are: \$100.00 until the bidding reaches \$25,000.00 and \$500.00 thereafter. The person making the highest bid recognized by auctioneer shall be the buyer. The auctioneer shall immediately present the Buyer with a document entitled Acknowledgment of Purchase for his or her signature. Consignor hereby consents to a blood sample being taken. If the post-sale test reveals the presence of EAS at such level as is deemed by the testing laboratory to show that EAS have been administered to the horse within 45 days prior to sale of the horse ("Positive Test"), Buyer shall have the right to rescind the sale, which right must be exercised by Buyer giving written notice to CTHS within 24 hours of Buyer's receipt of the results indicating a Positive Test. If Buyer elects to rescind the sale, Consignor shall refund any sales proceeds paid to Consignor by CTHS and pay buyer or CTHS all proper expenses and legal fees incurred by either of them, including interest thereon at the rate of 24% per annum, from the time of sale until the return of the horse to the Consignor. CTHS's determination concerning whether there is a Positive Test, as long as same is supported by the testing laboratory selected by CTHS, shall be fully binding upon Consignor, Buyer and all other interested parties. If any party challenges CTHS's exercise of discretion, subject to proof of fraud or bad faith, such party shall be liable for all of CTHS's reasonable expenses, including, without limitation, its attorney's fees incurred in defending the challenge.
